1. Background

Under the umbrella of ERA-HDHL the Joint Programming Initiative “A Healthy Diet for a Healthy Life” launched a cofunded call for the “Development and validation of biomarkers for nutrition and health, including biomarkers for food intake, nutritional status, diet-related health and diet-related diseases”. This cofunded call will contribute to the creation of an international Research Network on BioNH. This network of researchers, carrying out studies at a pan-European level, will establish a critical mass of expertise necessary in this research area, allowing excellent science, sharing of standardised and innovative measures and research infrastructures, as well as training of young scientists in the field of BioNH.

2. Registration

Researchers who intend to submit a transnational project proposal (coordinators and partners) are requested to register at the JPI HDHL Meta Data Base (<http://www.healthydietforhealthylife.eu/>) in order to be able to submit a proposal. In addition it is mandatory that they complete their profile information.

Forum for partnership

Researchers who are registered at the JPI HDHL Meta Data Base can join the [ERA-HDHL forum](#) to find partnerships.

3. Proposal submission

There will be a **two-stage submission procedure**: pre-proposals and full proposals. Both pre- and full proposals must be written in English and must be submitted to the JCS by the coordinator through the JPI HDHL Electronic Submission System exclusively (for instructions regarding the JPI HDHL Electronic Submission System, see Annex 2). The coordinators and all principal investigators of the consortium are required to register at the JPI HDHL Meta Data Base.

Pre-proposals must be submitted by the project coordinator before the **19th of April 2016 at 16.00 CEST**.

Full proposals must be submitted by the project coordinator before **the 15th of July 2016 at 16.00 CEST**. Please note that full proposals will only be accepted from applicants explicitly invited by the JCS to submit them.

Call deadlines are final and will be strictly enforced. The electronic system will not allow submissions after call deadlines! Please take into account that the online data entry may be overloaded by the day of the deadline. It is therefore recommended to upload all the required material in due time.

4. Pre-proposal structure

One joint pre-proposal document (in English) shall be prepared by the project partners, and must be submitted to the JCS by the coordinator. Only transnational projects will be funded (please see consortium properties described in the “Call text”).

10. Description of the Work Programme including the objectives, the rationale and the methodology, highlighting the novelty, originality and feasibility of the project (max. 2 pages)
11. Potential of the expected results for future public health and/or other socio economic health-relevant applications (max. 1 page)
12. Description of expertise and scientific excellence of the consortium and added value of the collaboration (max. 1 page).

Pre-proposals must follow the proposal template.

5. Full proposal structure

The information given in the pre-proposal is binding. Thus, any fundamental changes between the pre- and full proposals, e.g. composition of the consortium, objectives of the project, must be communicated to the JCS with detailed justification and will only be allowed by the Call Steering Committee (CSC) under exceptional circumstances (please see details on allowed changes in the "Call text").

Impact of expected results, including potential for health related applications; arrangements between participating partners regarding IPR; dissemination; knowledge exchange and commercial exploitation; data management and data/ material sharing.
15. Ethical issues (1 page)

16. Including informed consent, use of animals, according to national regulations.
17. References (max. 40)

Part C Overall budget plan (will be automatically generated in the Electronic Submission System)

The Electronic Submission System will automatically generated an overall budgetary table.

Full proposals must follow the proposal template. Four tables/figures can be uploaded in the Electronic Submission System.

6. Eligibility

Eligibility is subject to the national/regional regulations of individual funders. Applicants should refer to the criteria and requirements set out in Annex , and are strongly advised to contact their respective national/regional funding organisation prior to submitting the application. Note that an **eligibility check** is mandatory for some national/regional funding organisations **before** the submission deadline (see national regulations).

The JCS will assess proposals to ensure that they meet the call's formal criteria [e.g. date of submission; number of partners, inclusion of all necessary information in English etc.]. In parallel, the JCS will forward the proposals to the relevant national/regional funding organisations that will perform an eligibility check of compliance with their national eligibility criteria. Proposals passing both checks will be forwarded to the review procedure. Please note that after submission of the proposal once the joint transnational call has been closed it is not possible to amend the proposal or to add further documents.

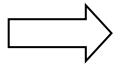

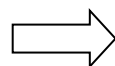

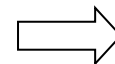
