# Generic Call for Proposals 2026

#### **IMPORTANT**

- 1. Franco-German projects shall only be evaluated by DFG Agency, according its own terms, through its "Research grants ((Sachbeihilfe)" Program. Full information available at the following address: http://www.dfg.de/france/anr\_nle
- 2. This document sets out detailed rules for the submission and funding procedures applicable to French teams working on Franco-German projects.
- 3. It is essential to carefully read the work programme 2026, the generic call for proposals 2026, the AAPG 2026 guide, the rules relating to ANR real cost funding allocation procedures (https://anr.fr/fr/rf/), and all of this document before submitting research project proposals.
- 4. In case of any difference of interpretation, the French version of the present annex shall prevail

# 1. BACKGROUND AND OBJECTIVES OF COOPERATION WITH GERMANY

By developing bilateral agreements with foreign funding agencies, ANR enables researchers to initiate or intensify their collaborations, as part of its plans to foster and give rise to outstanding teams in Europe and throughout the world.

The objective is to support innovative bi-national projects that **break away** from existing national projects and show seamless synergy between both countries' teams and genuinely integrated joint research.

In order to simplify and streamline working arrangements, create research funding without borders and contribute to building out the European Research Area (ERA), ANR and DFG (*Deutsche Forschungsgemeinschaft*) have decided to forge a partnership.

The "Lead Agency" procedure has been continued in 2026 for the selection of Franco-German PRCI ("International Collaborative Research Projects") projects. In this context, a joint project prepared by both countries' teams is evaluated by a single agency, the "Lead Agency", which manages projects' evaluation and selection. Transnational projects compete with the national projects of the Agency conducting the evaluation. The partner agency has access to all information regarding the projects. Each agency funds its respective national teams according to its own procedures.

The two agencies take turns yearly handling the submission, evaluation and selection of projects according to its own procedures. For 2026, **the submission and evaluation of project proposals will be handled by DFG**. The scientific coordinator and other partners of the French part **must** nevertheless provide ANR with certain administrative information in accordance with procedures described in this Annex.

The purpose of the partnership between ANR and DFG is to support projects in which there is genuine<sup>2</sup> collaboration between Franco-German partners.

Partners will ensure the complementarity of the scientific inputs of each country and the added value of the international cooperation. Insofar as possible, the French and foreign partners' projects must start and finish on the same dates. Please note that DFG has a **maximum project length of 36 months.** 

#### 2. RESEARCH PRIORITIES

All fields of science, with the exception of Humanities and social sciences. Project proposals in these areas should be submitted under the specific Franco-German call for projects in SSH

**(FR-All),** including transdisciplinary projects, in cases where they propose an approach largely centred on social and human sciences and/or when the coordinator comes from the humanities and social sciences<sup>3</sup>.

#### 3. SUBMISSION OF PROPOSALS

The French and German partners will prepare a joint scientific project. Each country's teams must designate a national scientific coordinator.

The submission and evaluation of project proposals will be handled by DFG.

Project proposals must be submitted by German coordinators to DFG via the DFG's ELAN submission website (<a href="http://elan.dfg.de/en">http://elan.dfg.de/en</a>), respecting the format and the details of its program for «Research Grants».

The deadline for the submission of applications to the DFG is January, 14th 2026.

# French partners:

**No registration** of intention to submit a project is required by ANR.

However, for administrative reasons, although the submission and evaluation are conducted by the foreign agency, the French participants must submit their proposals to the ANR via the ANR submission site:

- The same scientific project proposal as that submitted to DFG, in the same format. Note, the acronym and title of the project provided to each agency must be the same.
- The administrative and funding information linked to both French and foreign partners:
  - The detailed information is expected from the French partners. The French coordinator has to appear as scientific coordinator on the ANR submission website
  - o The **minimum**⁴ information is expected concerning foreign partners: the foreign coordinator (**country referent**)⁵, the name of the Institute⁶, its category (private / public), and the information concerning, requested funding by foreign partners to

- **A budgetary data sheet** for the French partners, detailing the requested means by major expense categories for the analysis of the consortium's budget request by ANR. This document is mandatory for your file to be considered complete on the submission site, cf. eligibility criteria. *The template of the document is available for download on the webpage dedicated to AAPG 2026.*
- A scientific panel responsible for the scientific monitoring of the project in case of success (description of the scientific panels is available in the AAPG 2026 text). Please note: this choice cannot be changed once the closing date and time has passed.

The French coordinator is subject to the rules (in particular of eligibility) to which all national scientific coordinators of the 2026 Generic call for proposals must comply (see AAPG 2026 Guide, § B.5.2. Eligibility of full proposals).

The deadline for submitting this information to the ANR is the day after the German submission deadline, January, 15th 5 p.m. (Paris time). Projects proposals must be submitted to both agencies at due time. Those submitted to only one agency will be rejected.

The submission website will open on the **November**, **17**<sup>th</sup> **2025**, the link will be indicated on the ANR website, on the generic 2026 call for proposals page.

#### 4. ELIGIBILITY

Each agency decides on projects' eligibility according to its own rules.

**ANR verifies the eligibility of the full proposals**, considering the criteria set out in the AAPG Guide § *B.5.2*, and detailed below:



- The budgetary data sheet<sup>7</sup>.
- The provisional project proposal duration must be the same for the two country partners.
- The ANR and the DFG exclude commercial companies, industrial technical centers and associations known as technical and/or technological centers.

To be eligible, proposals must meet all of the eligibility criteria of the two funding agencies.

### 5. EVALUATION

Projects shall only be evaluated by DFG in accordance with its own rules.

The DFG will propose a list of projects to be funded by ANR.

The two agencies then jointly validate the list of projects to be funded.

## 6. FUNDING PROVISIONS

#### 7. SCHEDULE

- Proposal submissions on the DFG website: January, 14th 2026
- Submission of copies of project proposals, budgetary data sheets, and administrative and financial information on the ANR website: **January**, **15th 2026**, **5 PM** (Paris time), **no registration**
- Joint decision and publication of results: October 2026 (indicative date)
- Possible project start date: final quarter 2026 January 2027 / to be adapted according to the foreign partner constraints.
