### 2. DESCRIPTION OF PSIA

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| <b>Abstract (publishable)</b> | <p>The MultiDiv project aims to investigate the concept of multispecies assemblages and process-relational understandings of diversity as a perspective to inform new modes of biodiversity governance that take into account the situated emergence of biodiversity challenges and their interconnectedness with other ongoing crises such as climate change and pollution.</p> <p>Multispecies assemblages are open-ended gatherings that include human and nonhuman actors that are constantly transforming each other. From that perspective, diversity cannot be reduced to a collection of nonhuman entities, but rather emerges in process as a set of context-specific human and non-human relations. This perspective will open up new ways of thinking about the interdependence of humans and nature that may enable seeing relations that have not been seen before and defining new ways of acting and governing to halt biodiversity decline.</p> <p>MultiDiv will achieve its aim through empirical research in and across two case studies in the Mediterranean region, a coastal area in Tunisia and the Rhone delta in France. The project's main objectives are i) to apply a multispecies perspective to cases of biodiversity decline in the two cases in order to enhance understanding of the intertwined processes that produce them; ii) to develop novel methodologies for tracing assemblages in multiple entanglements and assess how they affect biodiversity and iii) to co-develop with stakeholders novel modes of governance from an assemblage perspective and pathways to get there.</p> <p>MultiDiv will address these objectives through a multi-method approach, including ethnographic research, arts-based methods, participatory workshops within and across cases, and relation-based simulation modeling. This inter- and transdisciplinary approach will be facilitated by an interdisciplinary team that includes researchers from the humanities (philosophy, anthropology, science-technology studies), the social sciences (geography, sociology, political science, economics), the natural sciences (ecology) and social-ecological systems research and non-academic partners in the two case studies (Tunisia and France) who have extensive stakeholder networks and relations of trust in the region. In developing suggestions for multispecies assemblage-based governance and pathways to move towards it, we will also reach out to stakeholders at the international level, particularly from the CBD, UNESCO's MAB program and IPBES through our existing networks.</p> |

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| <b>Abstract (publishable)</b> | <p>The SHALCC project tackles the critical challenge of modeling managing shallow aquifers' water resources variability under climate change. These vital yet vulnerable resources are highly sensitive to climate variability and anthropogenic pressures. Unlike deeper confined aquifers, shallow aquifers are more exposed to surface processes, supporting river base flows, ecosystems, and human water supply, but are prone to overexploitation due to lower operational costs. The project aims to address two key challenges: developing hydrological simulations and projections for shallow aquifers under climate scenarios in both gauged and ungauged areas and creating hybrid modeling tools combining physics-based (PB) methods with deep learning (DL). These tools will simulate hydrological dynamics with accuracy and efficiency while ensuring physical consistency and broad applicability. The study focuses on regions with shallow aquifers over crystalline bedrock, including Normandy, Pays de la Loire, and Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur. These areas, with groundwater flows confined to shallow weathered and fractured zones (10–100 meters), exhibit diverse geological and climatic conditions. Flow patterns, driven by hillslope processes and linked to meteorological conditions, are highly variable. Climate change, with more intense and prolonged droughts, coupled with internal climate variability, exacerbates stress on these aquifers, highlighting the need for reliable modeling tools for poorly gauged or ungauged basins. The hybrid modeling approach integrates deep learning with physical constraints derived from process-based models, ensuring interpretability and applicability. Validated across contrasting Atlantic and Mediterranean climates, these models will improve predictions in diverse settings. Expected outcomes include scalable, user-friendly forecasting tools for groundwater management, accurate long-term simulations to assess aquifer vulnerability, and advancements in hydrology by integrating AI and physics-based methods. The project will support regional climate initiatives (SAGE, SDAGE, GIEC forecasts), aid local water planning (PTGE, water authorities), and enhance the national "AquiFR" aquifer modeling platform. Ultimately, SHALCC aims to advance hydrology by combining process-driven and data-driven modeling. By leveraging interpretable AI tools alongside process knowledge, the project seeks to improve understanding of water resource variability and provide innovative solutions for managing groundwater amidst climate change impacts</p> |

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| <b>Abstract (publishable)</b> | <p>Agroecological practices (AE) in vineyards, such as the establishment of ground covers to protect soil from erosion and enhance its functionality, biodiversity, and associated ecosystem services, have a scattered distribution and inconsistent implementation. In some regions, these practices are nowadays more widespread, although frequent problems of implementation and performance persist. In contrast, conventional management predominates in other regions, in which the soil is kept free of weeds through tillage and herbicides, while relying on synthetic agrochemicals for pest and disease control and fertilisation. VinAE proposes the creation of a network of pilot vineyards using AE practices located in five of the main European grape and wine producing countries: Italy, France, Spain, Portugal and Turkey. The pilot vineyards are established in the Mediterranean, Atlantic and Anatolian biogeographic regions, encompassing a wide range of edaphoclimatic conditions, topography and landscapes. This collaborative strategy is particularly valuable in a context of climate change, as knowledge generated across different climates can be highly relevant during adverse and abnormal events. In addition, the information available on AE practices often stems from partial analyses of their agronomic, environmental, and socio-economic impacts, carried out in scattered experiences. The multidisciplinary expertise of the partners (ranging from vinegrowers, who constitute the core of the project actions, to researchers experts in agronomy, environmental, biodiversity and social and economic sciences) will enable a comprehensive evaluation of AE practices in vineyards, addressing a wide range of scenarios and challenges. The VinAE project will adopt a participatory and co-creation strategy to leverage expertise from regions with longer-term implementation of AE practices, and the information from literature review, to improve and design solutions for issues identified in other viticulture regions. This project also proposes the use of already tested biotechnological tools (e.g. hydrogels, bioinoculants) and alternative ones (e.g. biofumigants), to maximise the performance of implemented AE solutions. The comprehensive evaluation of AE practices will encompass analysis of grapevine performance, must quality, water relations, soil carbon storage and stabilisation, and soil microbial and faunal diversity (with a special focus on pathogenic guilds). The impact of AE practices on soil fertility will include chemical and biochemical determinations, the use of automated systems and modelling. The proposal aims to assess the benefits of the AE practices on vineyard biodiversity and the balanced nutritional status of grapevines, important factors for enhancing pest and disease management. Finally, the project will also explore the feasibility and identify barriers to the widespread adoption of the most effective AE practices. This will enable the formulation of knowledge-based policy solutions for promoting their upscaling and wider implementation. The multi-actor consortium will ensure an effective dissemination of the key results obtained. The project also proposes establishing the base for the development of a cross-border Living Lab on AE practices in vineyards, using recommended and publicly available tools and methodologies to expand the group of key actors from the participating partners to other stakeholders identified within the project's framework</p> |

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| <b>Abstract (publishable)</b> | <p>Pesticides pose a threat to both human health and biodiversity. Within a regulatory framework aiming at reducing the use of conventional pesticides, the search for alternative methods, such as the use of biocontrol products (plant protection products whose active substance is of natural origin), has a great potential for agroecology. The Mediterranean plant <i>Dittrichia viscosa</i> (former <i>Inula viscosa</i> or woody fleabane), is an Asteraceae characteristic of wastelands, especially former vineyards. It shows a remarkable tolerance to drought and polluted soils, and a natural extract of this plant was found to have antifungal properties. In the BioPest_Boost project we propose a combined approach of genomics and chemotyping of <i>D. viscosa</i> populations from different Mediterranean countries in order to reach a better understanding of the genetic mechanisms involved in the production of the active compound, and a better understanding of its genome dynamics. The project will take advantage of the synergistic collaboration between (1) LGDP (Laboratory of Plant Genome and Development, Perpignan), an academic partner expert in genomics (structural variation, extrachromosomal DNA) who developed dedicated computational tools and (2) a private partner (AKINAO, Perpignan) with an expertise in the chemistry of natural products and who is currently developing a supply chain using <i>D. viscosa</i> to produce biopesticides. We will collect plants from wild populations in Europe and grow them in a common garden experiment in order to perform genome wide association study (GWAS) to identify the genomic determinants of the production of the active compound. Additionally we will unravel the structural variations responsible for the intraspecific variation in active compound production. Altogether the expected results will help, in the long term, establishing this weed species as a neo-crop for biopesticide production and gaining new knowledge on drought adaptation in a perennial herbaceous species.</p> |

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| <b>Abstract (publishable)</b> | <p>Citrus Huanglongbing (HLB) is a devastating disease responsible for major economic losses in citrus producing countries worldwide and is currently considered the number one threat to the global citrus industry. HLB is associated with three 'Candidatus Liberibacter' species, i.e., non-culturable phloem-restricted <math>\alpha</math>-proteobacteria from the Rhizobiaceae family. While the disease greatly impacts the major citrus producing areas (USA, Brazil, and China), it is still absent in Europe. However, in recent years, psyllids vectoring this pathogen have become established in the Mediterranean basin, including the major citrus growing areas of the EU. Despite their global importance and major threat for to the European citrus industry, the evolution of the HLB associated bacteria remain largely unknown and the currently proposed reference diagnostic methods suffer from a lack of specificity. The first part of this project aims to use an innovative protocol for bacterial DNA enrichment and sequencing to build a genomic database and clarify the phylogenetic relationships between the different 'Ca. Liberibacter' species and subspecies associated with HLB using whole-genome comparative approaches. The second part of this project aims to provide new insights into the mode of evolution of these bacteria through bioinformatic analysis of the genomic resources. This will allow us to better characterize the major evolutionary forces in these bacteria (i.e., relative importance of mutation and recombination), to characterize their accessory genomes and the vehicles of horizontal gene transfer, and to identify genes potentially associated with adaptive traits. Finally, the third part of this project aims to use the genetic polymorphisms highlighted between taxa to develop optimized molecular detection assays for 'Ca. Liberibacter' species and subspecies, and thus improve the monitoring of these bacteria, constituting a cornerstone of HLB management strategies.</p> |

#### How is the reporting on PS' contributions verified? –

1. The activity shall be included and clearly identified in the annual work plan –
2. In the annual report, there shall be a description of the activity (objectives, participants, indicators), its budget, the costs incurred by the PS in the relevant year, and its status (its beneficiary/ies). –
3. A PS Certificate shall support costs incurred by the PS
4. Costs incurred shall be **certified by an independent auditor** appointed by the PS or national funding bodies concerned
5. Other reporting requirements agreed upon between the PS and the Commission (e.g. on indicators) shall be fulfilled –
6. There shall be evidence that any **communication or publication on the activity has been labelled or co-labelled** as '[name of the activity]' is part of the PRIMA programme supported by the European Union

### Box co-labelling obligations

All participants in activities funded by the PRIMA Foundation or by Participating States of the PRIMA Programme must label or co-label any communication or publication related to their activities performed under the PSiAs.

If the obligations mentioned above cannot be implemented by your Funding Agency, at least the following acknowledgement should appear on the funding agency webpage where the PSiAs are listed:

Please provide that the PSiAs code and year of implementation are indicated with a direct link to the PSiAs webpage.

Whenever [country/funding agency] reports to the PRIMA Secretariat on its PSiAs, it will be necessary to provide supporting evidence that any communication has been co-labelled. For this reason, you may be requested to provide evidence of co-labelling (e.g., print screens of websites).

### Box with Description of the Applicable common principles to all the actions and activities

In accordance with Article 6(9) of the PRIMA Decision (EU), activities included in **AWP 2025** that are funded by the PS without the Union financial contribution shall be implemented in compliance with common principles adopted by PRIMA-IS after obtaining approval from the Commission.

#### Equal treatment

Participation in PSIAs, including the right to receive funding, should in general be open to any type of legal entity, private or public. It is understood and acceptable however, that national legislation or specific objectives of an action may dictate that only certain legal entities, e.g. public institutions, can participate and receive funding in certain actions.

Funding to PSIA actions should to the largest possible extent be allocated through open calls for proposals, and the PRIMA programme should be mentioned in the call text. It is understood and acceptable however that existing national research infrastructures and organisations, e.g. publicly funded research institutes, can be used to implement parts or the entire PSIA. Funding may therefore not be allocated through open calls for proposals, but either through internal competition within the research infrastructure or according to an overall strategic research plan.

The principle of equality and non-discrimination based on gender, racial or ethnic origin, religion or belief, disability, age and sexual orientation should be observed and promoted.

#### Transparency

Evaluation and selection criteria and details of the review process should be published before applicants submit proposals. The awarding of funds through calls for proposals or through institutional funding is made public.

Any communication or publication related to PSIAs, whether undertaken by the PRIMA Foundation, a Participating State, or participants to an activity, shall be labelled or co-labelled as '[name of the PSIA] is part of the PRIMA programme supported by the European Union'.

#### Independent peer review evaluation

Applications submitted through open calls for proposals should be evaluated by panels of leading independent domestic and/or non-domestic experts (peer review).

In case of direct funding to a national research infrastructure or organization, the quality of the research output by the national research infrastructures or organization should be assessed on a regular basis and structured manner, preferably through independent peer review.

#### Ethics and scientific integrity

The principles of scientific integrity as defined in the European Code of Conduct for Research Integrity should be observed and promoted.

Fundamental ethical principles and in particular those related to the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union, the European Convention on Human Rights and its Supplementary Protocols, should be adhered to and enforced, both during selection of actions for funding and during the subsequent implementation of the actions.

#### Exploitation and dissemination of results

The findings of research activities included as PSIAs in the PRIMA annual work plan must be made available to the research community and the public in a timely manner.
